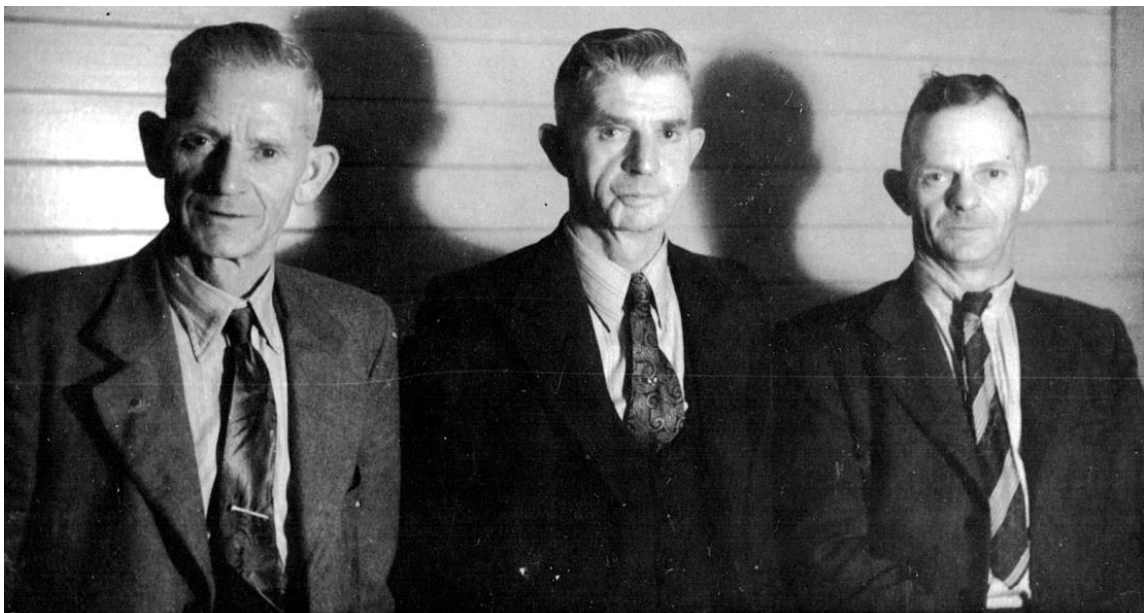

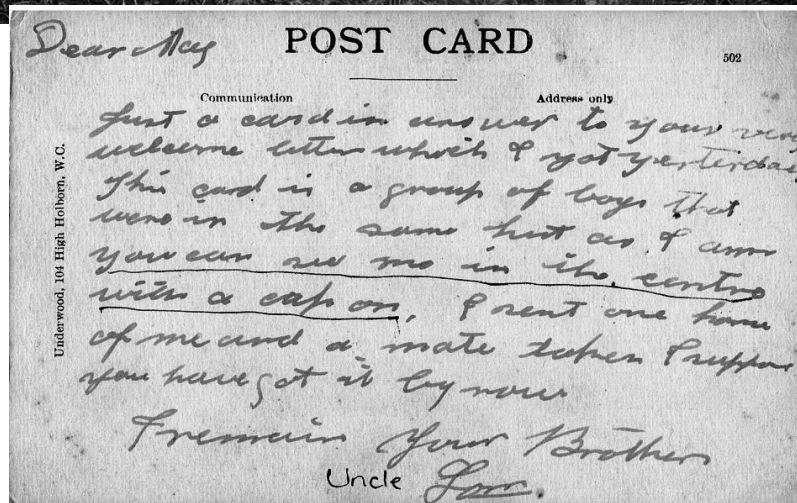

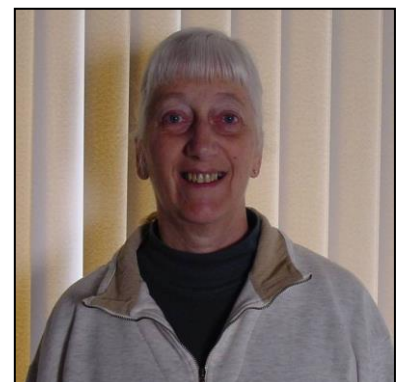

THE IHLEIN FAMILY IN AUSTRALIA 1855 -2004

JOURNEY TO AND EARLY DAYS IN AUSTRALIA

On the 11th February 1851, Franz Carl IHLEIN and Maria Magdalena (Maggie) NIESER were married in the Catholic Church of St Dionysius at Neckarsulm Württemberg Germany. They were second cousins and had to have Papal Dispensation before being allowed to marry. Franz Carl's Mother and Magdalena's Father were first cousins.

Four children were born by 1854, though the fourth child only lived two weeks. At this time the German states were in economic and political turmoil. Bismarck wanted Germany united by brutal force and the country was in crisis. Franz Carl worked as a vine dresser.

Australia was actively seeking migrants. Franz Carl and Magdalena decided to look for a better life in Australia. They became Bounty Immigrants and their fare was paid by the N.S.W. Government. Their Eldest Child Franz Bernhard was sickly so was left in Neckarsulm Germany with his Grandparents Johann and Magdalena NIESER, Johann was a forest Ranger. Franz Carl's father Joseph Martin IHLEIN had been a municipal Constable. Franz Bernhard IHLEIN (the child who remained with the grandparents) died at age twenty six of Consumption (T. B.)

Franz Carl, Magdalena and two children left Germany, probably in December 1854, for England where they boarded the large ship Commodore Perry at Liverpool. (it was noted on the Captain's passenger list that both Franz Carl and Magdalena were literate). Oral history tells us that the third child Franz Carl IHLEIN died and was buried in England. His death was registered in Liverpool England in 1855. Katharina Josepha their second child made the long four month voyage with her parents who arrived in Sydney 26 April 1855. Passengers disembarked on 1st May 1855 after a week's quarantine at Spring Cove.

They went to live at Terry's Meadow now Albion Park, where Franz Carl worked as a dairy farmer. Nine children were born in Australia, Franz Carl became known as Charles 1. That was the name he used when registering the birth of his children. The birth of Charles the second child born in Australia was not registered. When Franz Carl (Charles 1) registered in 1881 the death of George his address was given as Tullimbar.

Sometime after 1881 and well before 1898 Franz Carl and Magdalena moved from Albion Park to Sydney. In that same decade their son Charles and Daughter-in-law Elizabeth (Grandma IHLEIN) and their family moved from Berrima to 40 Pritchard St Annandale. The movement occurred during or just before the recession of the 1890's. Franz Carl and Magdalena lived in a house on the Orange Grove estate. This estate was a dairy farm and was on the site where Callan Park Hospital now stands. In the 1890's this dairy farm

supplied much of Sydney's milk. Franz Carl was still an employee of the dairy farm, when he died age 74 on the 20 Jan 1899. Magdalena predeceased him; she died on the 27 Jan 1898 aged 72.

AVIE AND HENRY HENES

Avie Giebel HENES (on her headstone) married Henry HENES (other known spellings as HENESS HAINESS HANIS HEINESS) in 1854 in Frankfurt on Maine Germany, about 70 miles from Neckarsulm, home town of Franz Carl IHLEIN.

They migrated to New South Wales, probably in the same year. Avie came from Eldfeldt (Eidfeldt) and Henry from Kurrhassan. She was 23 or 24 years old and he was 29 or 30 years old. On arrival in N.S.W. they finished up at Sutton Forest, Henry working as a gardener, about 9 shillings a day, on a property "Ivy Hall" owned by John BADGERY, a wealthy land owner from Exeter.

They probably lived in a farm cottage. Avie may have done domestic work for the owners or manager, a William ELLSMORE knew them and reported subsequent births and deaths. Their first child Elizabeth (grandma IHLEIN), was born in 1855, Henry 1855-6, Madelina in 1858-9 and Mary Jane on April 19th, 1861.

The Attending doctor at the last mentioned birth could have been Dr. Park, assisted by midwife May Lyons. Sadly they were also present on the 4th May, 1864 for the birth of twins George and John, sadly because Avie died in childbirth and was buried in Sutton Forest, Cemetery attached to St PATRICK'S Church by Rev. W. LANIGAN.

Also the twins are buried in the same Grave as Avie John 4 Sep 1864 4 months and George 1865 13 months.

St PATRICK'S Church was constructed by Robert METZ Husband of Katharina Joshepha METZ (nee IHLEIN).

Note: This family History was sought and compiled by Peter IHLEIN and his wife Marie of Camden NSW with additions by Robert and Kerrie IHLEIN.

There is a grave and tombstone in the Cemetery Attached to St. Paul's Catholic Church at Albion Park NSW of George IHLEIN. Inscription is:

SACRED TO THE MEMORY OF GEORGE IHLEIN WHO DEPARTED THIS LIFE ON THE
26 JANUARY 1881 AGE 19 YEARS MAY HIS SOUL REST IN PEACE

3 *SAILING SHIP 'COMMODORE PERRY'*



A medium clipper ship built in 1854 by Donald McKay, East Boston. Her dimensions were 202'x42'1"x28"5" and tonnage 1964 tons. A sister ship to the *Great Tasmania*.

Launched at the shipyard of Donald McKay, East Boston, MA: Sold while still on the stocks to James Baines, Liverpool, for his Black Ball line of Australia clippers, for £ 24.000

1855 January 12

Made her first Australian voyage

The New Packet Ship *Commodore Perry*...

This is the pioneer of McKay's line of European Packets; and a magnificent ship she is, both in model and workmanship. She will register between 2300 and 2400 tons, has three decks, a full topgallant forecastle, which extends to the foremast, a large house before the main hatchway, and a full poop deck, 55 feet long. We have not been able to procure her exact dimensions, but by pacing her deck and guessing, we give her length on deck as 212 feet, extreme breadth of beam 47½ feet, and depth 29 feet. She has very little dead rise, but great width of floor. Opposite the main hatchway, across the floor, between the curves of her bilge, she is 36 feet wide; and although she has all her spars aloft and her boats stowed on the top of the house, and on gallows frame. She only draws 10½ feet water, on an even

keel, and has not an ounce of ballast in her hold. Here then, are two rare elements combined, buoyancy and stability. We have little hesitation in asserting that there is not another ship of her capacity, which will stand up like her, under the same circumstances. She has fair ends for sailing, with slightly concave lines below, but almost semi-circular above; and her bow is ornamented with a bust of her namesake, in naval uniform. Her stern is rounded, and is ornamented with a large gilded eagle, and her name in gilded letters is over it, also her name is on each quarter, and on the curves of the bow. Her bottom is painted green, and the rest of her hull black; inside she is buff-colour. Notwithstanding the space occupied by the topgallant forecastle, the house and poop, she has very spacious deck room for working ship, and grand accommodations below for second class and steerage passengers. Her main deck has three cargo ports on each side, square air ports for state-rooms, and large ventilators amidships, and along the sides of the house. The deck below has also three cargo ports on each side; and the height of her decks is between 7 and 8 feet.

She has two fine cabins; the after one finished in beautiful style, with fancy woods, gilding and flower work, and the forward one, a dining saloon, though white, is richly ornamented with gilding, and both are handsomely furnished. Her accommodations throughout are upon nearly the same scale as the Australian clippers, recently built by Mr. McKay.

The ship herself is a wonder of strength. her frame, nearly all her knees, all her hooks and pointers, are of white oak, and she is diagonally cross braced with iron, and all her ceiling, from the bilge to the covering-board, is scarphed, square fastened, keyed, and bolted edgeways. She has two depths of keel, each 16 inches square, four depths of keelson's, two depths of sister keelson's, and double bilge keel sons on each side, and the rest of her ceiling in the hold varies from 12 to 10 inches in thickness, and above, from 8 to 6, with thick work over and inside of her waterways, and her outside planking varies from 8 to 5 inches in thickness. She has also eight wing-stanchions on each side, which clasp the beams of two decks, and are kneed below, and the amidships stanchions also extend double under the beams of two decks. Without going into further particulars, we may safely sum up, by stating that she is, in every particular, a well-built ship.

She has built lower masts; hard pine topmasts and jibbooms, double topsail yards, (the lower ones standing,) and is rigged upon Capt. Howe's principle.

She has sliding-gunter royal masts, so that in bad weather these can be sent down, and thereby ease her aloft, without interfering with the yards on the masts below.

She is well found - has eight capstans, a large windlass, Crane's chain stoppers, six boats, and a patent steering apparatus and a wheel-house. We advise those who wish to see an original design for a packet ship, to call and inspect her.

She is commanded by Capt. Beauchamp, one of the most experienced and successful sailors belonging to Boston, and is owned by her talented builder, Mr. Donald McKay.

Her sister ship, the *Japan*, will be launched in a few days, and when she is completed, we shall endeavour to obtain the full particulars of her construction and equipment. The *Com. Perry* is now lying at the Junction Railroad wharf, East Boston. Call and see her.

It has been suggested, but no proof as yet, that their route to Liverpool to board the "Commodore Perry" was: Neckarsulm-Hamburg-Hull-Liverpool.

'COMMODORE PERRY' FROM LIVERPOOL 1855 (THE IHLEIN'S JOURNEY)

This splendid ship, belonging to Messrs Baines and Co., commanded by Captain Mundle, arrived from Liverpool on Saturday last, after a passage of 85 days. She sailed from Liverpool on 11th January, with about 800 passengers for this port and Sydney, and experienced fine weather throughout the passage, but the last fortnight or three weeks the winds have been light and baffling. On 10th January, exchanged signals with the ship Sebastopol, outward bound from the same port; crossed the equator on 6th February; on 4th March, in lat. 46° 5' S., long., 16° 55' E., passed the first iceberg, and continued to meet with berg and field ice until 9th March, when the last berg was passed in lat. 49° 9' S., long. 34° 10' E.; the highest southern latitude reached was 51° 38' S. ; passed the longitude of Cape Leuwin on 23rd March, since which the wind was easterly and light. The greatest run made in the 24 hours was 300 miles. On 4th April the Harriet Armitage, for Melbourne, was spoken off Cape Otway. There are about 350 statute adults for this place, selected by Joseph Bonney, Esq., for the St. Andrew's Society; and 50 Irish labourers sent out for the Fingal road trust; there are also about 300 German vine dressers and planters for Sydney. The deaths have been--amongst the Scotch 10, one adult, one sixteen years old, and eight

three years old and under; amongst the Germans 18, all children; amongst the Irish there was no mortality. On Sunday morning the president and committee of the St. Andrew's Society, with several other gentlemen interested, including the Rev. R. K. Ewing and Captain Mundle (who came up to town the previous day in the Titania), proceeded down the river in the steamer Cobra, taking a supply of beef, potatoes, apples, &c. for the emigrants. On approaching the ship, although prepared for wonder, all were astonished at the immense object floating before them, and as the steamer drew alongside some seven or eight hundred heads were thrust over the bulwarks - Scotch, Irish, Germans - men, women, and children. Great surprise was expressed at the state of cleanliness in which the ship was found, and very great praise is due to Captain Mundle for the prudent exercise of that forbearance and decision which secured for him-self the esteem of all, and the observance of those regulations so essential to the harmony of a large number of people. Acting as cicerone, Capt. Mundle led his visitors all over the vessel, pointing out and explaining the most noticeable objects of his floating empire. In the first place, the vessel's sides are some twenty feet out of the water; she has three decks, -the lower one being occupied by the Germans. Over the main deck are beams supporting the boats, spare spars, &c., and a gangway on both sides, railed in, and leading from the poop to the top-gallant forecastle. In the latter part there is a fire engine capable of throwing a jet of water the entire length of the ship. The lower masts are, like those of a man-of-war, built of several lengths of timber, nicely fitted, and secured by numerous and massive hoops. On looking aloft the eye is arrested by the singular appearance presented by the double topsail yards attached to each mast. This arrangement is to facilitate the taking in of canvas in bad weather. The lower yard is fixed to the lower mast by a truss, like the main yard, a short distance below the top; the upper yard traverses the topmast in the ordinary manner, the sheets of the upper one hauling down through the lower yard, and those of the lower through the main yard. In fine weather both topsails are set, but when it becomes necessary to shorten canvas the upper yard is lowered down to the cap of the mainmast, thus doing away with the difficult and dangerous operation of reefing. The rudder is worked by Robinson's patent steering apparatus, the novelty of which consists in the employment of the screw instead of tiller chains; and its superiority is manifest in the slightest motion of the wheel being sufficient to influence the rudder. On the rudder head, and coming up through the board that covers the other part of the apparatus, is a brass hand, which moving horizontally and in unison with the rudder, indicates its exact position.

The duty of steering the vessel is exclusively confided to six quarter-masters, whose office is portrayed upon their caps in letters of gold. Passing now from the deck into the saloons, one is astonished at the extent to which ease and elegance have been attained. The sides are formed of highly polished satin wood, maple, and rose-wood, thickly studded with fretwork and columns in gold. Mirrors, marble-top tables, splendid carpets, and velvet cushions assist to make up a display of magnificence unknown to even oriental luxury. About twelve o'clock, the people having been assembled, the Rev. R. K. Ewing held a short service on the deck, addressing them from the 27th verse of the 7th chapter of Ezra, -"Blessed be the Lord God of our fathers." He reminded them of the gratitude they owed, the privileges they possessed, the religious freedom which they would here enjoy, and the

glorious future before them; he charged them solemnly to take God's word to be their guide - to select and constantly attend upon the ministry of the teacher under whose instructions they expected to derive most profit, and in all their transactions to exhibit those virtues which are the offspring and adornment of the Christian character. The service being concluded, it was intimated that there was an infant to be baptized, which ordinance was performed: as there will probably be a few curious to know the names given to the "ocean child," we annex them: Joseph Mundle, Chisman, McKenzie, Buchanan. The Scotch emigrants having dispersed, the Germans took possession of the deck, and held a service in their own way, as usual: the Irish paid their devotions below. We may here mention that Mr. Chisman, the respected chief officer, conducted divine service every Sunday during the passage.

Altogether the emigrants for this port are an intelligent and respectable body of people, and likely to prove a valuable addition to our population. Captain Mundle speaks in the highest terms of commendation as to their conduct on the passage; and they, appreciating the kindness of the Captain and his desire to make them as happy as possible, give expression to similar sentiments in reference to him.

This is not the first occasion on which Captain Mundle has visited Launceston.

Some four or five years ago he commanded the Martha, taking horses hence to India and New Zealand. We congratulate him upon his advancement, and especially upon the success of his last passage to Australia. He has been exceedingly fortunate in holding together so large and varied a number of people without any disturbances, or even a complaint. Long may he be spared to discharge duties for which he has proved himself so well qualified? The Commodore Perry is anchored at Lagoon Bay, and will not come up any higher. Should the steamer Pirate arrive in time, she will bring up the immigrants and their luggage. The hiring will commence on Saturday morning.

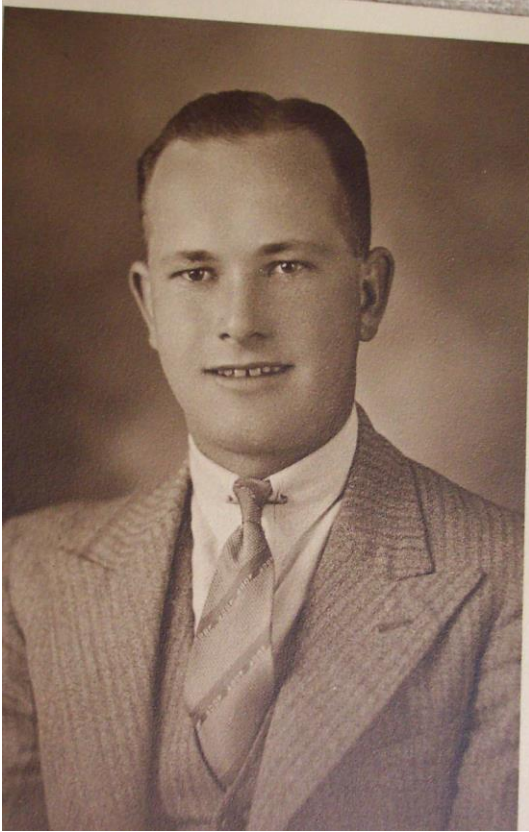

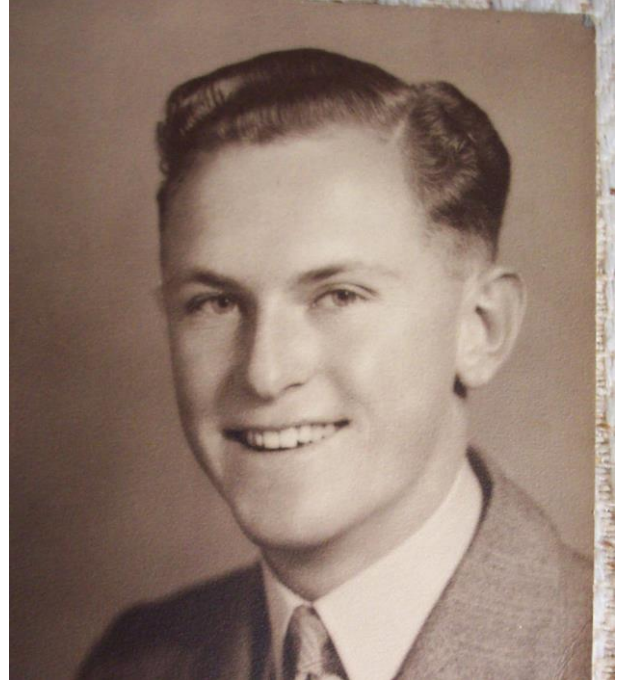

CHARLES WILLIAM IHLEIN: (Grandson of Joseph) was born on the 10 March 1906 at Leichardt New South Wales.

He grew up in that area Living at 398 Young Street Annandale and was Educated at Annandale Public School and Leichardt Junior Technical School.

He completed his schooling in 1922: He then completed his apprenticeship as an Electrical Mechanic.

On the 4 February 1928 He married Caroline Elizabeth FARRAH (Bess) at the St Aidan Church of England at Annandale, by the Reverend Robert ROOK.

In 1928 Betty Merle was born. The family lived at Noble Ave East Banks town. Joyce Ellen was born in 1930. Betty recalls going to school while still living in east Banks town. During the Depression they lost their home and moved to Punchbowl near Joseph IHLEIN. They then moved to Annandale after William FARRAH died in October 1934 to live with Caroline and Edith FARRAH.

Twelve months later they purchased a home at Edgar St West Banks town and lived there. Kathleen Anne was born in January 1937. War broke out in 1939 & Charlie was in a protected industry and was not able to enlist in the Armed forces.

Charlie was badly injured when an electrical switch board he was working on blew up. He was burnt as well as electrocuted and spent a long time in Sydney hospital and was back home again for Kath's fifth birthday in January 1942.

Leonie Edith was born July 1944. Betty married Cam WOOD in January 1947. (They had five children).

Robert William was born November 1948 and the family moved to Warragamba Dam in 1949 leaving Joyce to board at Banks town.

Joyce married Charlie PIKE in 1950. (They had three children). The remaining children grew up at the dam and went to Primary school there. Kath went to Penrith High School and worked at the local garage. Kath married Bert HINTON in 1955. (they had four children).In 1954 the land at Gwandalan was purchased and Charlie spent many years of his holiday and weekends building the home there.

Leonie studied at the Conservatorium of Music in Sydney and boarded with friends in Marrickville.

Robert went to Nepean high school for one year, and then Wyong High School after the family moved to Gwandalan at the end of 1962.

Leonie married Mike Collins in 1963. (They had two children).

Charlie had been working weekends as an electrical contractor in and around Gwandalan and week days in Sydney until he retired from the Sydney Water Board at the end of 1965.

Robert started work at Broken Bay National fitness camp in 1966, 1968 He joined the Army.

Robert married Veronica McIntosh in 1970. (They had three children).

In 1973 Charlie retired from the Workforce.

In all Charlie & Bess had five children, 17 Grandchildren, 22 Great grandchildren and one Great Great grandchild, as at June 2003.

Charlie Passed away in 1983 and his Ashes are scattered in a unmarked location at Palmdale Crematorium Ourimbah NSW. Caroline passed away in 1985 and her Ashes are scattered in an unmarked location at Mt Thompson Crematorium Holland Park QLD. They had both instructed that there be no plaques for their resting places.

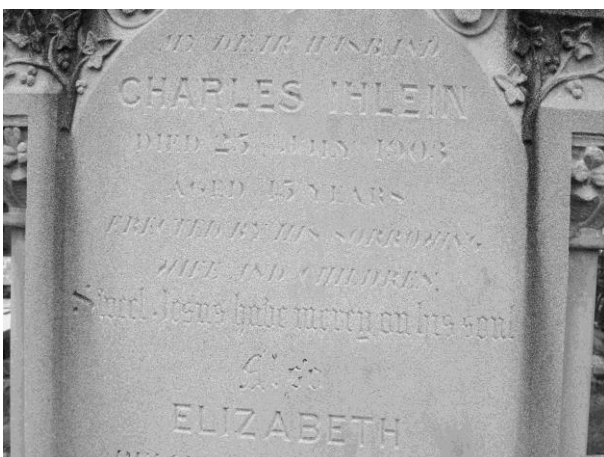

In 1857 a new school and residence were being built in the village under the Denominational School Board.

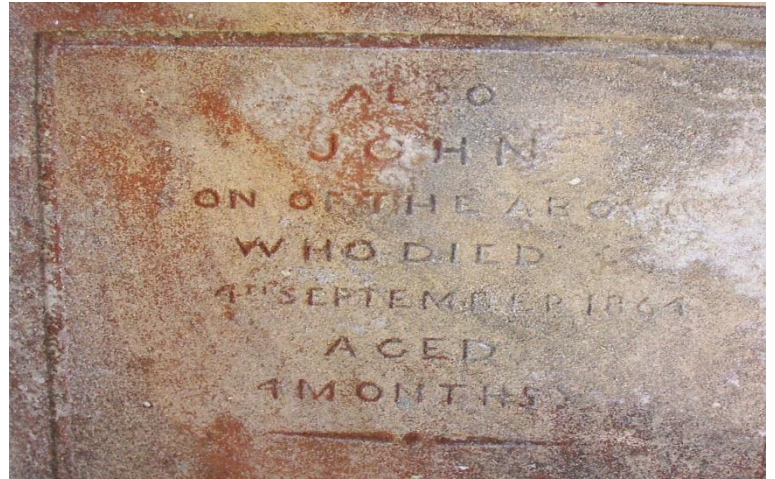
During 1863 the school had an enrolment of 55 pupils housed in a slab building in good repair. The building was also used for church purposes. The school closed in 1869.

The station church at Sutton Forest is described by Father Rioradon (Parish Priest of Berrima) in 1878 as a timber building 56 feet by 15 feet with seating for 72 people - the chapel being in a bad state of repair. Tenders had been called for the erection of a new church with 150

pounds in hand and a further 150 pounds promised. Mr. R. Metz a well known Berrima tradesman won the tender and was contracted to build the new church for the sum of six hundred and fifty four pounds; the building to be of stone in the clear 53 feet by 25 feet and walls 16 feet high.

On the 27th October the foundation stone was laid by Archbishop Vaughan and was opened for worship in 1879.

It would appear that extensive repairs were carried out to the building around 1900 when the original shingle roof was replaced with iron. (B.L.)

Franz Carl IHLEIN was the son of **Joseph Martin IHLEIN** (citizen and wine-grower of Neckarsulm – 1791-1827) and **Juliane** (nee **NIESER** – 1792-1860) and was born on the 19th Aug 1824 in Neckarsulm, Germany. The family were Catholic. Franz Carl's father Joseph Martin Ihlein had been a Municipal Constable.

Maria Magdalena NIESER was the daughter of **Johann Joseph NIESER** (citizen and wine-grower of Neckarsulm – 1789-1856) and **Maria Magdalena** (nee **HAY** – 1790-1865 or 1868). She was born on the 01 Feb 1826 in Neckarsulm, Germany and was baptized on 01 Feb 1826 in St. Dionysius, Neckarsulm, Germany. Maria's family were also Catholic.

Letter from Germany says: Wedding permission of the 21st of January in the year of 1851. Proclamation at the 3rd, 4th and the 5th Sunday after Epiphany (Greek and means the day of the three sacred Kings on the 6th of January).

Franz Carl IHLEIN and **Maria Magdalena NIESER** were married on 11 Feb 1851 in Neckarsulm, Germany. The Preacher was **Mister Vogelmann**.

The Witnesses were:

Franz Joseph BAUER, Field Judge of Neckarsulm

Ignaz ROEMMELE, wine grower of Neckarsulm.

The third degree of blood relationship was dispensed.

Maria Magdalena NIESER was a second cousin of **Franz Carl IHLEIN**. Franz's mother and Magdalena's father were first cousins, and they had to have Papal Dispensation before being allowed to marry.

Letter from Germany says that the church and the old town of Neckarsulm were completely destroyed during World War II.

Franz Carl IHLEIN was a citizen and winegrower of Neckarsulm who emigrated with his family in 1855 to Australia. Australia was actively seeking migrants and Franz Carl and Magdalena decided to look for a better life in Australia. They became Bounty Immigrants and their fare was paid by the NSW Government.

Their eldest child **Franz Bernhard** was sickly so he was left in Neckarsulm, Germany with his grandparents **Johann and Magdalena NIESER**, Johann was a Forest Ranger.

The **IHLEIN** family travelled to Liverpool to await their departure for Australia and while there, their son **Franz Carl** died in 1854. He was aged 7 months.

Franz Carl, Maria Magdalena and Katharina Josepha came to New South Wales, Australia in 1855 on the ship 'Commodore Perry'. The ship sailed from Liverpool in 1855 and arrived in Sydney on the 26th April 1855. A four month journey. Passengers disembarked on the 1st May 1855 after a week's quarantine at Spring Cove. The passenger information lists **Franz Ihlein** aged 31, work/calling Vinedresser; **Maria Ihlein**, aged 29, **Catherine Ihlein**, aged 3. Their religion was Roman Catholic. It was noted that both adults could read and write.

1. Franz Bernhand IHLEIN

He was born on 02 Mar 1851 in Neckarsulm, Germany and died on 19 Jun 1977 in Neckarsulm, Germany.

Franz was in hospital, where he died of weakness and exhaustion on the 19 Jun 1877 at 4.30am and he was buried on the 21 Jun 1877 at 10.15am. His father's occupation was listed as Farm Hand. He was aged 26 years, 3 months.

2. Katharina Josepha IHLEIN

She was born on the 28th Feb 1852 in Neckarsum, Germany.

Katharina married **Robert METZ** in 1875. He was born on 07 Aug 1846 in Berrima, NSW, Australia.

They had one child.

Katharina died on 02 Apr 1876 in childbirth (76/5012) in Berrima, NSW. (Aged 24) Her daughter **Mary Anne METZ** was born on the 31 Mar 1876 in Berrima, NSW and died on the 02 Apr 1876.

(*From Peter Ihlein*) St. Patricks Church was constructed by **Robert METZ** husband of Katharina Josepha (nee IHLEIN).

Robert died on the 09 Jun 1901. (Aged 54)

4. Maria Theresia IHLEIN

She was born on 11 Aug 1854 in Neckarsulm, Germany.

She died of 'sickness – Gout' on the 26th Aug 1854 at 8pm in Neckarsulm, Germany. Maria was 14 days old.

Maria was buried on the 27 Aug 1854, at 4pm.

5. Mary Magdalena (Lena) IHLEIN

She was born on the 07 May 1856 in Kiama, NSW, Australia

Mary married **Thomas WEBSTER**.

She died on the 29 Oct 1931 in Randwick, NSW, Australia. (Aged 75)

She is buried with her mother and father in the Rookwood Necropolis Cemetery, NSW.

6. Joseph IHLEIN

Joseph was born on the 28 Jun 1857 in Kiama, NSW, Australia.

Joseph married **Margaret Mary HICKEY** on the 30 Dec 1887 in St. Joseph's RC, Balmain, NSW. Margaret was aged 24 and Joseph aged 31.

Margaret was the daughter of **James HICKEY** and **Mary RYAN** and was born on the 01 Jun 1863 in Morpeth, NSW.

In the NSW Electoral Rolls for 1888-89 Joseph is listed as residing at Grove St. Balmain.

In the 1891 NSW Police Gazette is the following article:

Leichhardt – **Joseph IHLEIN**, residing in Joseph-street, Leichhardt, reports that about 8.10 pm the 13th instant, some person fired a revolver through his bedroom window, from a vacant allotment adjoining his house, the bullet just missing his wife and embedding itself in the wall.

In the John Sands Directories for 1889-1891, 1895/6/7/8/9, and 1904, **Joseph IHLEIN** is listed at Joseph St., Leichhardt. **Mrs M IHLEIN** is listed in 1891.

In the Sydney (Sands) Directory 1902, Joseph is listed at Joseph Street, Leichhardt. It looks like he lives in Joseph Street on the corner of Grove Street.

Early Federal Electoral Rolls 1903

At Joseph Street, Lilyfield, **Margaret Mary IHLEIN** is listed. Her occupation is Domestic Duties. **Joseph IHLEIN** is listed with his occupation as Labourer. **Sarah IHLEIN** is also listed at Joseph Street, her occupation Domestic Duties. This is probably Joseph's brother Henry's wife.

In the NSW PO Directory (Wises) 1904, Joseph is listed at Grove-st., Leichhardt.

Joseph died on the 03 Mar 1911 in Granville, NSW and was buried in the Rookwood Cemetery, Sydney. (Aged 53)

Charles married **Elizabeth HENES** on the 01 Jun 1880 in Berrima, NSW, Australia. Elizabeth was the daughter of **Henery HENES** and **Avie GIEBEL** and was born in 1856, in Wollongong, NW, Australia. The **HANESS** is spelt in many different ways. **HENES, HENESS, HAINESS, HANIS, HEINESS.**

In the **John Sands Directory 1881-2**, Charles **IHLEIN** is listed at Albion Park and Charles **IHLEIN** snr is listed as a stonemason at Tullebar.

In the **NSW Electoral Rolls 1888-89** Charles is listed as living 'Freehold' at Joseph Street.

John Sands Directory 1889

Charles **IHLEIN** is listed as a Dairykeeper, living at Joseph Street, Leichhardt.

John Sands Directory 1891

Charles **IHLEIN** is listed at Prichard St., Leichhardt.

John Sands Directory 1896

Charles **IHLEIN** is living at Joseph Street, Leichhardt.

John Sands Directory 1897/1898

Charles **IHLEIN** (snr & jnr) are listed at Pritchard St., Annandale.

John Sands Directory 1899

Charles **Ihle** is at Joseph Street, Leichhardt.

John Sands Directories 1900, 1901 /2

Charles **IHLEIN** is listed at Pritchard St., Annandale.

John Sands Directory 1902

Charles **IHLEIN** is listed in Pritchard Street, Annandale, occupation quarryman.

Early Federal Electoral Roll 1903

Charles is listed at Pritchard Street, occupation Quarryman. Elizabeth is listed with her occupation as Domestic Duties.

Also listed are their two eldest children. **Charles Robert IHLEIN** with his occupation as Meat Preserver, and **Elizabeth IHLEIN** with her occupation as Domestic Duties.

Charles died on the 25 Jul 1903 at 40 Pritchard St. Annandale, NSW. (Aged 45)

Margaret Caroline IHLEIN was born on 30 Jan 1864 in Terry Meadows, Kiama, NSW, Australia.

Margaret's 'husband' was **Arnold BUHR** – they didn't marry (he had a wife in Germany). Arnold was the son of **Theodore BUHR** and **Christina Van ESSEN** and was born on the 23 Mar 1859 in Mayen, Germany.

Arnold was a baker, he had been in the Military in Germany as a baker. He was 1.63mtrs tall, had blond hair and green eyes. In Sydney he owned a bakery. He left Sydney in a hurry as the Police were after him for selling sly grog. He changed his name and called himself **William ADAMS**.

He had lived with Margaret in Sydney and sent her out to NZ first I think. At Dargaville Margaret ran the Boarding House, and William ran the Bakery and Store. I believe he was into sly grogging again but this time it wasn't on his premises.

Notes from Auntie May

He was a baker and had health problems from the dust of the bakery and was recommended a change of climate.

Notes from Aunt Connie

She said her father had a child to another woman and bought the baby home for his wife to bring up (a girl). This was in Dargaville and ties in with what a local from there, Bill Gillespie has told me. I believe the baby died.

Margaret did tatting and all the girls were taught.

The family also remember her keeping in touch with 'Aunt' Lena, her sister.
